KEY POLL FINDINGS

The data in the latest polling conducted by Remington Research Group among 2022 General Election voters in Iowa's 3rd Congressional District show the political environment has moved markedly against Joe Biden and the Congressional left and that raising taxes to pay for infrastructure – and especially by increasing the death tax – are broadly unpopular among in this district.

POLITICAL ENVIRONMENT

President Joe Biden's image and approval rating are inverted, with a 46% favorable and approval rating, and a 48% unfavorable and disapproval rating. A Republican candidate leads the generic ballot by 4 points and, in a hypothetical matchup, Congresswoman Cindy Axne trails a Republican candidate by 3.

Q: What is your opinion of Joe Biden?

Favorable: 46% Unfavorable: 48% No opinion: 6%

Q: Do you approve or disapprove of Joe Biden's job performance as President?

Approve: 46% Disapprove: 48% Not sure: 6%

Q: If the 2022 General Election for United States Congress were held today, would you vote for the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate?

Republican: 48% Democrat: 42% Undecided: 10%



Q: If the 2022 General Election for United States Congress were held today, would you vote for the Democrat Cindy Axne or would you vote for the Republican candidate?

Cindy Axne: 43% Republican: 45% Undecided: 12%

TAXES AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Raising taxes to pay for an infrastructure plan that spends little on so-called "hard infrastructure," like roads and bridges, is widely unpopular with voters. 3 in 1 respondents are opposed.

Q: Do you support or oppose raising taxes on small businesses for an infrastructure plan, only 10% of which funds roads and bridges, while the rest funds liberal priorities like housing, community college, and green energy?

Support: 19% Oppose: 57%

Shifting to proposals to pay for infrastructure, raising the death tax is particularly unpopular in this district by a -46 margin, proving a powerful message against the potential legislation.

Q: Do you agree or disagree that raising the death tax is a good idea?

Agree: 13% Disagree: 59%

METHODOLOGY

Survey conducted June 9 through June 11, 2021. 800 likely 2022 General Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2022 General Election. Margin of Error is +/-3.3% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding.
