#### **KEY FINDINGS**

American Action Network surveyed Americans in 7 middle-of-the-road Congressional Districts to gauge voter sentiment about economic proposals being considered in Congress. The data show the left's "Build Back Better" agenda is toxic, and that Americans believe the liberal \$3.5 trillion spending proposal will only increase the economic pain families are already feeling.

#### **BIDEN APPROVAL RATING UNDERWATER**

President Biden's job approval rating has turned sharply negative across all districts surveyed. The President is upside down by an average of 7 points across these districts.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

Surveys were conducted August 28 through August 30, 2021 the following seven Congressional districts: CA-10, FL-07, IA-03, MI-08, MI-11, VA-02 and WA-08. 800 likely 2022 General Election voters participated in each of the seven surveys. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2022 General Election. Margin of Error is +/-3.2%. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding.
