Republican Primary Voters in Safe GOP Congressional District Surveys


Methodology

- AAN commissioned American Viewpoint to conduct a survey among likely GOP primary voters in Safe GOP congressional districts to understand attitudes and opinions on Ukraine funding.
- There were three separate studies in, with the first study being conducted February 24th-27th, 2024. The second conducted March 19th-24^{th,} 2024 and the final study conducted March 27th-28th, 2024.
- For each study, the margin of error in the 187 CDs (n=500) is +/- 4.4% at the 95% confidence level. The margin of error among sub-groups is greater.



PUTIN IMAGE AND UKRAINE STATEMENTS – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS

Putin is seen as an enemy and Russia's actions in Ukraine are seen as wrong by GOP primary voters in safe seats. While there is a debate over how it should be done, a clear majority of GOP primary voters believe that the U.S. should be doing <u>something</u> to help Ukraine.




A plurality of GOP primary voters in safe seats believe the U.S. should provide aid to Ukraine, be it military and humanitarian, or only military aid.



AID PACKAGE ELEMENTS – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS – RANKED BY STRONGLY FAVOR

The elements most popular in a package are focused more on **protecting Americans and stopping Russia** as a whole than those about Ukraine specifically.

The following are elements of an aid package for Ukraine that could be part of the legislation. Please indicate if you favor or oppose each.



AID PACKAGE ELEMENTS – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS – RANKED BY STRONGLY FAVOR

A large majority of GOP primary voters favor aid in the form of a loan and nearly two-thirds favor helping to pay for it by seizing Russian assets.

UKRAINE AID SUPPORTING ARGUMENTS AND INFORMED BALLOT – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS

Key messaging focuses on <u>helping the American military --</u>rebuilding the industrial capacity and refilling stockpiles, as well as stopping Russia in order to keep them from invading other former Soviet countries and to not embolden bad actors.

UKRAINE AID SUPPORTING ARGUMENTS AND INFORMED BALLOT – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS


Giving the aid as a loan that is supported by President Trump is one of the strongest messages to tamp down anger among those opposed to providing aid. 8% switched to favoring aid and 5% switched to opposing aid after hearing supporting and opposing messages indicating the small number of persuadable voters.

CONGRESSIONAL UKRAINE AID SUPPORT EFFECT – SAFE GOP PRIMARY VOTERS

GOP primary voters split on whether they would be more or less likely to vote for a Member who supports providing additional aid to Ukraine. There is a large portion of voters who say it won't make a difference underscoring that this is **not** <u>likely a top issue Members need to worry about in a primary.</u>

Conclusions & Recommendations

- GOP primary voters are relatively split on the issue of aid for Ukraine, but a plurality of primary voters in safe seats support some type of aid. Moreover, a clear majority of these primary voters think that in general the United States should be helping Ukraine as they see Putin as an enemy and Russia as in the wrong for their invasion of Ukraine.
- 2. There is a core group of about 1/3 of GOP primary voters who are very difficult to move. As a whole, the persuadable vote on this issue is small and this is not likely a driving factor in a primary outside of that 1/3 of primary voters.
- 3. The focus of any package is protecting the United States. This includes funding our troops, refilling military stockpiles, ensuring Putin doesn't become even more ambitious in his invasions, and stopping our enemies such as North Korea, China, and Iran from becoming emboldened. Similarly, our best messages focus on Russia, not Ukraine.
- 4. Support for aid for Ukraine is much stronger with older voters (both general and primary) as well as more centrist and Traditional Republicans. The inverse is the case with very conservative and Trump Movement voters.
- 5. Giving the aid in the form of a loan is supported by a majority of GOP primary voters in safe districts and general election voters in battleground districts. Similarly, seizing Russian assets to help pay for the aid to Ukraine is widely supported by GOP primary voters.

(OUR BORDERS) Rather than using American tax dollars to protect another country's borders, our tax dollars are better spent here at home, including being used to secure our southern border.	58%
(EUROPE NOT ENOUGH) It is not fair for the United States to continue to be the primary source of aid to Ukraine. Other European countries need to step up and provide assistance in our place.	55%
(BLANK CHECK) It is wrong to continue providing a blank check of American tax dollars to a country involved in a war with no end in sight and which Ukraine ultimately may not be able to win.	44%
(CORRUPTION) There is a long history of corruption among public officials in Ukraine and the United States has no idea how the tax dollars we are sending Ukraine are being spent.	44%
(NOT OUR RESPONSIBILITY) It is not the United States' responsibility to be the world's policeman protecting everyone. The Ukraine-Russia War is a European problem, and it is their responsibility to end the conflict, not ours.	34%
