Re: Congressional Battleground District Survey – Executive Summary

McLaughlin & Associates just completed a survey on behalf of the American Action Network in the 17 most competitive battleground Congressional districts in the country. *These are the swing districts of the swing states* that will in all likelihood determine the outcome of the Presidential race and control of Congress.

Voters overwhelmingly oppose a government shutdown!

- Nearly two-thirds of likely voters, 64%, OPPOSE a government shutdown, with a majority, 52%, who strongly oppose
 it. Opposition to a shutdown extends to swing voters, as well as large percentages of the Republican base.
 - o Swing voters, such as Independents (63%), ticket splitters (65%) and moderates (75%) overwhelmingly oppose a shutdown.
 - Even large percentages of GOP base voters including Trump voters (39%), conservative Republicans (38%) and Republican primary voters (43%) oppose a government shutdown.

- In addition to the broad opposition to a shutdown, 62% of voters clearly support a compromise to avoid the shutdown.
 - o Again, swing voters such as moderates (77%), Independents (64%) and ticket splitters (69%) overwhelmingly support a compromise as do significant percentages of the Republican base, such as Trump voters (39%), Republican primary voters (43%) and conservative Republicans (37%).

• Fifty-eight percent (58%) of voters say "Keeping the federal government up and running and fully funding government programs like Social Security, the Veterans Administration, and the United States Border Patrol" should be the top priority for the President and Congress vs. only 36% who say "Dealing with the illegal immigration crisis, securing the border, and preventing illegal immigrants from voting in the elections" should be the top priority.

Methodology:

McLaughlin & Associates conducted a survey of 800 likely general election voters in Targeted United States Congressional Districts, from September 5 – 9, 2024. A multi-modal approach was employed via live telephone calls and self-administered text messages. The live telephone interviews were conducted by professional interviewers with respondents contacted by both landline phone and cell phone. Thirty three percent (33%) of interviews were completed on traditional landlines, 34% were conducted on cellphones and 33% of interviews were conducted via text message. Interview selection was random, and interviews were stratified by area, house district, race/ethnicity, age, gender, and political party registration to correlate with actual voter turnout from previous general elections. This poll of 800 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 3.4% at a 95% confidence interval. Congressional Districts included: ME-02, AZ-01, AZ-06, NC-01, PA-01, PA-07, PA-08, PA-10, PA-17, OH-09, OH-13, MI-07, MI-08, MI-10, NE-02, WI-01, WI-03.
